Series Speakers

Lynnette Osterlund, MD Palliative Care: "A Voice for My Choice"

Dr. Osterlund first came to the University of Tennessee Medical Center in 2011 as Medical Director of University Palliative Care. Dr. Osterlund received her medical degree from University of Illinois- Chicago, James Scholar. She completed her Clinical Pastoral Education residency at Tampa General Hospital. She also completed Anesthesia Critical Care Residency and Fellowship at the University of South Florida. Dr. Osterlund is board certified in Hospice and Palliative Medicine and has been named City View Top Docs in 2014, 2015, and 2016. She is a graduate of Physician Leadership Academy, class of 2015 and was sole provider of Palliative Care to ALS population of a regional referral center.

Leslie Hamilton, PharmD, BCPS, BCCP "Medications in Alzheimer's"

Leslie A. Hamilton, PharmD, BCPS, BCCCP, is an Associate Professor of Clinical Pharmacy at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center College of Pharmacy. She practices in neurology and critical care at UT Medical Center. Prior to joining UT, Dr. Hamilton served on faculty at Auburn University for three years and practiced in pulmonology and critical care. Her interests are critical care, neurology, nutrition, and infectious disease. She completed a PGY1 residency at Moses H. Cone Hospital in Greensboro, NC, and a PGY2 residency in critical care/nutrition support at the University of Tennessee/Regional Medical Center in Memphis.

Roberto Fernandez-Romero, MD, MPH, PhD "Overview of Alzheimer's Research"

Dr. Fernandez received his medical degree from the Universidad Autónoma de Centro America in his native Costa Rica. He received a Masters of Public Health degree and a Ph.D. in neurobiology and anatomy at the University of Rochester Medical Center (Rochester, NY), where he subsequently completed a residency in neurology and fellowship in behavioral neurology.

He served as Assistant Professor of Neurology at University of Virginia since from 2012-2016 and is currently Medical Director of The Pat Summitt Clinic at the University of Tennessee Medical Center.

Dr. Fernandez research focuses on Alzheimer's disease and cognitive aging. He has developed a method to measure brainwaves that are generated by visual motion and has described significant changes that differentiate normal aging from early stage Alzheimer's. His current work combines the brainwave techniques with MRI, tests of cognitive function and a virtual-reality driving simulator. The goals of his research are to elucidate some of the earliest changes that occur in Alzheimer's, determine how those changes affect critical behaviors such as vehicular driving and develop new diagnostic tests for early detection and assessment of disease progression.
